

UPDATE ON REFUGEE PROJECT

On Saturday, 14 April, the Bakewell churches will again be joining together to welcome a group of women and children from Sheffield for a day out in the country. This is an initiative, started by ABC in response to the needs of asylum seekers and refugees. Whilst this project has been ongoing since June 2016, early last year it was decided that the emphasis of the hospitality group should be placed on offering hospitality to women involved in the Sheffield Snowdrop project. These women are victims of human trafficking and, accordingly, have serious problems with trust, communication, etc, etc.

In April, the women and children will be brought to Bakewell from Sheffield on the Community bus, and returned in the same way at the end of the day.

Various activities will be organised at the Friends Meeting House and at the Methodist Church, eg jewellery making, hand massage, bag decoration, badminton, football, to name but a few. These activities will be on hand before and after lunch.

At lunch time the group will walk up to the Parish Church, where a vegetarian lunch, supplied by all of the volunteers, will be served to our guests. There have been 4 visits so far. The first, an overnight stay for a group of men, was not particularly successful, but the three, day-long visits which took place last year for women and children, were.
