Collect of the Day

God, our refuge and strength,
bring near the day when wars shall cease
and poverty and pain shall end,
that earth may know the peace of heaven
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

First Reading: Micah 4.1-5

In days to come
the mountain of the LORD's house
shall be established as the highest of the mountains,
and shall be raised up above the hills.
Peoples shall stream to it,
²and many nations shall come and say:
'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD,
to the house of the God of Jacob;
that he may teach us his ways
and that we may walk in his paths.'
For out of Zion shall go forth instruction,
and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.
He shall judge between many peoples,
and shall arbitrate between strong nations far away;
they shall beat their swords into ploughshares,
and their spears into pruning-hooks;
nation shall not lift up sword against nation,
neither shall they learn war any more;
⁴but they shall all sit under their own vines and
under their own fig trees,
and no one shall make them afraid;
for the mouth of the LORD of hosts has spoken.

For all the peoples walk,
each in the name of its god,
but we will walk in the name of the LORD our God
for ever and ever.

Second Reading: Romans 8.31-3rd

³¹What then are we to say about these things?
If God is for us, who is against us? ³²He who did not
withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us,
will he not with him also give us everything else?
³³Who will bring any charge against God's elect?
It is God who justifies. ³⁴Who is to condemn?
It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised,
who is at the right hand of God, who indeed
intercedes for us. ³⁵Who will separate us from the
love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or
persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or
sword? ³⁶As it is written,

'For your sake we are being killed all day long;
we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered.'

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than
conquerors through him who loved us.

³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor
angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to
come, nor powers, nor height, ³⁹nor depth, nor
anything else in all creation, will be able to separate
us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
