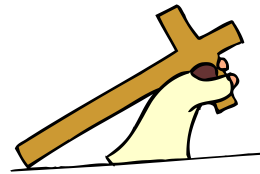

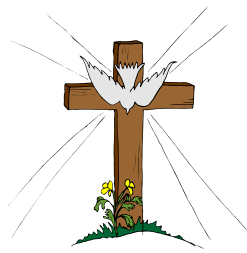

Dear Friends

Христос Воскрес is the Ukrainian Easter greeting, “Christ has risen,” and in response during Easter midnight service the congregation answer, Воістено Воскрес! (“Indeed he has risen!”). Where and how most Ukrainian’s will celebrate Easter Day is unknown, given the displacement of three million plus refugees around Europe, the systematic destruction of cities and towns under siege and the horrific trauma of the daily will to survive.

But given the spirit and determination of Ukrainian’s to fight for their freedom and not bow to the Russian onslaught, the spirit and meaning of the Easter hope will not be lost even if people worship in unfamiliar settings this Easter. Christ will be very much alive as his resurrection gives hope for peace, justice, restoration, renewal and transformation. Someone once wrote: Totally without hope one cannot live. To live without hope is to cease to live. In the difficult and challenging world we live in with the uncertainties we face and the pain, grief and sorrow people carry, you might say hope is in short supply. often confusing world in which we live today, hope, for many people, is something that seems to be short supply. But we need hope, it is one of the key Christian attributes and one of the most important gifts we can give to the world today.

Easter tells the story of Jesus entering the raw emotions of our world – becoming one with us in all life’s experience, transforming what feels to be a succession of Good Fridays into the hope and promise of life at easter, that always comes.

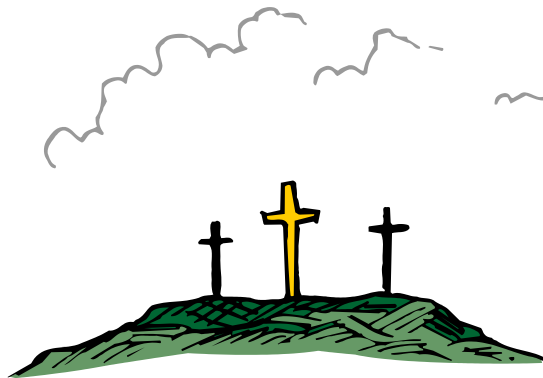
