

A Word from St Anne's

March is the month when Winter turns to Spring, and the new life that comes with the changing seasons blossoms forth! This year March is also the month when the season of Lent begins, when all Christians are called to practice self denial and, (perhaps more significantly, I always think) engage in contemplation of matters spiritual, which is to say, those things which are beyond and above those things which are "everyday and material."

At St Anne's in Over Haddon we are asking people to contemplate how we should use our village church so that it plays a wider part in the life of the community, and this will be an on-going theme for a new form of church service that begins on Sunday the 27th of February.

This is when we are starting an experimental "Congregation-led" service at 10am on the fourth Sunday of each month. It may seem a bit ambitious when our regular congregation is so small! But, as they say, "nothing venture nothing gain." It aims to be fairly informal whilst following the general structure of "Morning Worship in ordinary time." Nevertheless, we would certainly welcome any input from the wider benefice from anyone who feels able to contribute, perhaps on a one-off basis, in the form of, for example, a talk, a poem, a prayer, or something of a musical nature. We aim to create an event that is welcoming, varied and inclusive.

Hello,

I am Dana Samir Ibrahim Esawi. I am from Palestine and I live in Zababdeh town in the northern West Bank located 15 kilometers southeast of Jenin. First, I would like to introduce myself in a short way, but rather detailed one. We are a small family, which consist of five persons, I have two brothers and no sisters and I am the eldest of them. My brother, who is younger than me, is 18 years old, this is the last year at school, and he is preparing to enter University and my other brother is in 10 grade. My father works as a nurse in the ICU at ST.LUKE'S HOSPITAL in Nablus town, my mother quit her job in Paltel before 7 years and now she works as a housewife. Now I am going to talk a little bit about my educational life; I am 20-year-old university student. This is my third year at the university and I am studying English language and translation. I graduate from the school in 12 grade with a high average 96.1 and the result of this that I got the second level in all branches of my school in all of Palestine. Indeed English language and translation consider as a very interesting and wonderful major according to my opinion, actually I am very happy in this major. My university name is Arab-American University, which is 2 kilometers away from Zababdeh. After all of what I say, I will explain a little about my beautiful town, which is called the town of coexistence and peaceful. The number of people living in is 5000 people, Christians and Muslims, there are 4 churches and 2 mosques. I am a daughter of the Anglican Church led by Reverend Saleem Dawani. Our church consists of approximately 300 members. There is also a very effective clinic belonging to the church, which is located close to the church. I am always do my best to help my church whether in kids, youth and other activities. The last thing I would like to talk about my ambitious after I finish my last year at university I would like to complete a Master's degree in legal translation; moreover, when I finished my Master I will return to Palestine and works as a creative and intelligent translator, who teach students maybe in the school, I hope so.
