It is to help the people of the Diocese of Bujumbura plant saplings to protect lives and livelihoods from being washed away by seasonal rains.

Soil erosion causes fields, crops, animals, homes and schools to disappear down hillsides, due to flash floods. The trees help stabilise the land and, of course, counter the effects of climate change.

Ringer's surprise!

David Blackwell, a ringer from Clowne, visited Bakewell's practise night recently. He said he learned to ring tower bells in the 1950's whilst a pupil at Lady Manners School but left Bakewell shortly afterwards.

On the ringing chamber wall hangs a framed 1959 photograph of three schoolboys being shown the tenor bell by the then tower captain Clyde Bateman. The tenor bell had been taken from the belfry to have its wooden headstock replaced with an iron one complete with roller bearings. Barry Bateman, Clyde's son and a friend of the three schoolboys, took the photograph and donated it to the tower many years later.

David was asked if he recognised any of the schoolboys in the photograph. Imagine everyone's surprise when David recognised himself in the photograph. He didn't remember it being taken but was delighted that his school friend Barry had recorded the occasion. After an evening of ringing on his old bells -the first time in over 60 years -David left with a promise to visit Barry who now lives in Edensor.
