



A Word from St Anne's

On the fourth Sundays of June and July we have been privileged to welcome members of the parish church to our normal morning service at our little village church. In August we are joining the Parish church congregation at their morning service.

There will, however, be an event at the church on the following day, the 25th - August Bank Holiday Monday - when we will be having a Cream Tea , in aid of the charity Friends of St Anne's, which (weather permitting) will be held on the flat grassy area outside the front of the church overlooking the churchyard and Lathkill Dale. You are, of course, all cordially invited! We hope, also, to attract tourists and walkers visiting Lathkill Dale on the Bank Holiday.

Friends of St Anne's was set up about 20 years ago to help pay for church and churchyard maintenance and improvements. As our churchyard is still "active" (in that burials still take place) we are responsible for its upkeep and at the time, to save money, it was proposed that we ask the probation service to provide teams of people serving Community sentences to carry out the work (which they did at that time free of charge). There was a negative response to this in the village and, following a public meeting, a charitable organisation, which called itself "Friends of St Anne's," was set up to pay for the churchyard maintenance, and other church improvements, with the aim, especially, of attracting support from people who might not attend church regularly but who wanted to keep the church (and the churchyard) open.

It has been very successful over the years, and not only is the churchyard maintained on a regular basis but other modest improve-

ments have been carried out, such as the handrails by the steps leading up to the front porch, and the stone paving below them. Recently we have replaced one of the outside benches at the front of the church that was falling apart. But, as with all charitable bodies that spend money, fund raising is a constant requirement! Hence the cream tea (we have them periodically) and a current recruitment drive to get new members who make regular payments to the charity.
