The Collect

Almighty and everlasting God,
who in your tender love towards the
human race
sent your Son our Saviour Jesus
Christ
to take upon him our flesh
and to suffer death upon the cross:
grant that we may follow the example
of his patience and humility,
and also be made partakers of his
resurrection;
through Jesus Christ your Son our
Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. Amen.

First Reading Isaiah 50.4-9a

The servant of the LORD said: The
Lord GOD has given me the tongue
of a teacher, that I may know how to
sustain the weary with a word. Morn-
ing by morning he wakens – wakens
my ear to listen as those who are
taught. The Lord GOD has opened
my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did
not turn backwards.

I gave my back to those who struck
me, and my cheeks to those who
pulled out the beard; I did not hide
my face from insult and spitting.

The Lord GOD helps me; therefore I
have not been disgraced; therefore I
have set my face like flint,
and I know that I shall not be put to
shame; he who vindicates me is near.
Who will contend with me? Let us
stand up together. Who are my ad-
versaries? Let them confront me.

It is the Lord GOD who helps me; who will
declare me guilty? All of them will wear out
like a garment; the moth will eat them up.

--Passion Gospel Matthew 26.14-27.66--

Pilate: Which of the two do you want me to
release for you?

Crowd: **Barabbas.**

Pilate: Then what should I do with Jesus who
is called the Messiah?

Crowd: **Let him be crucified!**

Pilate: Why, what evil has he done?

Crowd (louder): **Let him be crucified!**

Pilate : I am innocent of this man's blood; see
to it yourselves.

Crowd: **His blood be on us and on our
children!**

Evangelist: Those who passed by derided him,
shaking their heads.

Crowd: **You who would destroy the
temple and build it in three days, save
yourself!**

**If you are the Son of God, come down
from the cross.**

Evangelist: That is, 'My God, my God, why
have you forsaken me?' When some of the
bystanders heard it, they said,

Crowd: **This man is calling for Elijah.**

Evangelist: At once one of them ran and got
a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a
stick, and gave it to him to drink. But the oth-
ers said,

Crowd: **Wait, let us see whether Elijah
will come to save him.**

Prayer after Communion

Lord Jesus Christ,
you humbled yourself in taking the form of a servant,
and in obedience died on the cross for our salvation:
give us the mind to follow you
and to proclaim you as Lord and King,
to the glory of God the Father. Amen.
